

Using the Conference Player to Watch Webinar Recordings

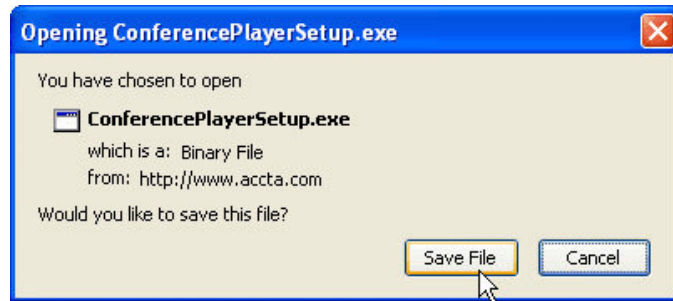


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Procedure

- Download the Player at:
<http://www.accta.com/Free/ConferencePlayerSetup.exe>
- Save the file on your computer in a location that you can easily find.



- Find the downloaded file, double-click on the file name and follow the prompts to install the program.
- Download your recording if necessary. It will have a “.nca” extension.
- Double-click this file name to launch the player and your recording.

Playing the Recording

- The recording should look something like the picture below. Use the four buttons to Start, Pause, Stop, and Mute the playback.
